A reminder of the importance of ASI's Anti-Trust Compliance Policy and its application to all participants was also provided.

CHAIR	ASI Board Chair, Sasha Courville, took the Chair.
QUORUM	The Chair noted that a quorum of Members was present at the meeting and declared the meeting open.
CHAIR REPORT	The Chair shared reflections on ASI's key results, governance highlights and the development of ASI's current strategy. The Chair tabled the audited 2023 Directors' Report and
	Financial Statements, which had been circulated to Members in advance of the meeting. Members were invited to comment upon and ask questions on these during the panel session.
ELECTED DIRECTORS	The recently elected Directors were identified and congratulated, as previously advised to Members, and outgoing Directors were thanked for their service.
ELECTED ASI STANDARDS COMMITTEE MEMBERS	The recently elected ASI Standards Committee members were identified and congratulated, as previously advised to Members, and outgoing Committee members were thanked for their service.
	The introduction of 2 new Observer roles to the Standards Committee for Indigenous Peoples Advisory Forum (IPAF) members, as previously advised to Members, was noted as a capacity building opportunity that can support IPAF's growing engagement in ASI's work.
	The contributions of Working Group participants and the Secretariat were also acknowledged.
CEO REPORT	The ASI CEO, Fiona Solomon, discussed ASI's strategy and provided updates on progress and future challenges. ASI's six key focus areas for 2024 were presented, and linked to 2022–2025 outcomes in ASI's theory of change. The 6 priorities noted were the rollout of ASI's GHG Pathways Method, preparing for the next standards revision cycle to be delivered in 2027, the ASI complaints mechanism, Indigenous Peoples Advisory Forum (IPAF) workstreams, and two important development projects in ASI's digital ecosystem.

DIRECTORS PANEL

Attending Directors participated in a live panel discussion and Members had an opportunity to ask questions of the Board and CEO. Topics discussed included: ASI's interaction and collaboration with other standards and frameworks; ASI's role in advocating for 1.5C aligned decarbonisation strategies; driving circularity in the aluminium supply chain; and building capacity in the auditor and assurance space.

Q&A WITH SECRETARIAT

Members had the opportunity to ask questions of the ASI Secretariat on program activities and general matters. Topics discussed included: how ASI is driving change through the audit process and through 'beyond certification' activities with IPAF, including in Guinea; benchmarking and harmonisation of ASI standards; building awareness of the ASI Complaints Mechanism and working with mining members on their complaints processes; and how ASI promotes member certifications and stories to encourage peer learning.

There being no further business, the meeting was declared closed.
