#### **ENTITY OVERVIEW**

The Entity consists of two sites – the Changchun site and the Nanjing site. The Changchun site, Constellium Engley (Chang Chun) was established in late 2009 and mainly engaged in automotive structure manufacturing. In 2023, it produced and sold over 6,000 tonnes of Aluminium automotive structure to customers located in China. Our main customers include BMW, Mercedes Benz, Audi, and Hongqi. The production area is approximately 13,000 m². The Facility includes one office building, two workshops, one goods house, heavy and mobile equipment area, equipment and supply storage, chemical storage, Hazardous Waste storage, a transformer distribution room and a computer room.

The city area is approximately ten kilometres (km) from the Facility, and nearby sensitive receptors include the Guieredougou Classified Forest (approximately 30 km east) and the Xinkai River (approximately 10 km west). Key external Stakeholders include the Government of Chaoyang, the Sanyou automotive structure, the Yingxin community, the fourth work's hospital and Ouya supermarket.

The Nanjing site, Constellium Automotive (Nanjing) was established in 2018 and is primarily engaged in automotive structure manufacturing. In 2023, it produced and sold 30,000 sets of front rails to customers located in China. Its main customer is Ford. The production Area is 20,000 m² and has over 30 employees on-site. The Facility has three floors. On the first floor, there is one office, three workshops, one warehouse, one maintenance house, one lab house, one chemical library and one Hazardous Waste house. The second floor includes six meeting rooms. The third floor includes one warehouse and six offices.

The city area is ten kilometres from the Facility, and nearby sensitive receptors include the Yangtze River (Chang Jiang) (approximately 2 km east). Key external Stakeholders include the Government of Xingang, Zhongjiatong Logistics Park, and the Xingang Hospital.
